The Wine

Few wines captivate us to the extent champagne does. But Champagne is not simply a wine; it is also a state of mind. Champagnes have a celebratory status no other wine has. Handed a glass of champagne, we simply abandon ourselves to its implied pleasure. No thought required. More than any other wine, champagne unlocks wine's archetypal promise: Joy.

The History

Contrary to legend and popular belief, Dom Perignon did not invent sparkling wine. The oldest recorded sparkling wine is Blanquette de Limoux, which was apparently invented by Benedictine Monks in the Abbey of Saint Hilaire near Carcassonne in 1531. In the 19th century Champagne was noticeably sweeter than the Champagne of today. The trend towards drier Champagne began when Perrier-Jouët decided not to sweeten his 1846 vintage prior to exporting it to London. The designation Brut Champagne, the modern Champagne, was created for the British in 1876.

Terroir

Only relatively recently have European wine makers given overt recognition to the grapes they grow. Of course they knew their universal names, though they often used local jargon instead. But they had a firm belief that it was the land that gave the wine its character, not the grape. The grape was inherited from the generations before and replanted when necessary. It was but the part of the statement of the land, the soil, the drainage, the weather, humidity or lack of it, water supply, the angle of the vineyard towards the sun - in short, the whole natural environment. The French have a word for this concept: Terroir, which does not translate directly into English. In its holistic use of term includes the people, customs, traditions, even the local food of an area. More commonly, however, Terroir relates to the land, nearby lakes, rivers and seas, and the climate as it affects the working vineyard. In a new wine region the Terroir is examined before suitable grapes are chosen. In Europe the grape varieties are there because they have always been. The forefathers had decided what to plant based on Terroir.

Avant-garde Old World wine producers are often said to use New World techniques.

Mollydooker

The Magical tale of Mollydooker starts with a love story...

Sarah and Sparky Marquis started out as winemaker for Sarah's parents at Fox Creek, McLaren Vale in 1994. They developed and implemented their Marquis Vineyard Watering Program in the vineyards, which produced the exceptional grapes that would go on to make their award-winning wines.

Over the next few years, they went from strength to strength; they won the bushing King and Queen Trophy for Best Wine in Show three times and were crowned Australian Boutique Winemakers of the Year, as well as Australian White Winemakers of the Year.

After years of working in the industry for others, in March 2006, their tale of love, hard work and determination led them to start their own brand, Mollydooker.

The term itself being Aussie slang for a 'left hander', was a befitting name for their company as they were both Mollydookers.

In June 2006, Robert Parker reviewed their very first vintage for Mollydooker. He rated The Boxer as the 'Best Value Red Wine in the World', Two Left Feet as the second, and Maitre D' as the fourth.
